THE NEW PLACE SURVEY:

1. The Place Survey consultation is still open and suggested questions and technical guidance may change.
2. The Place Survey findings for 2008/09 will not be released until Spring 2009.
3. The Place Survey can be carried out annually, biennially or every three years.
4. If the Place Survey is carried out every two years, CLG estimate there will be no additional costs (based on three year costs for existing surveys covering BVPIs, planning, benefits, libraries and tenants).
5. The 20 questions are designed for both County and District level authorities: who will undertake the survey?
6. What meaningful outcome, or legacy, can be achieved from inclusion of Place Survey indicators in the transitional LAA 2008/09.
7. The guidance indicates the new Survey must be branded for clear understanding by local residents, how will this be done for a transitional LAA?
